

## Community Infrastructure Grants – Recipients

### **City of Albany - Eyre Park All Abilities Regional Play Space**

\$54,956

The City of Albany is creating an all-abilities play space. Nine sensory/play pieces will replace the current play equipment. Rubber soft fall will be installed and internal pathways that are wheelchair accessible will be incorporated into the play space. The existing liberty swing will be also be relocated to a more inclusive location.

### **City of Armadale - accessibility upgrades at Memorial Park**

\$20,000

This project will enable the City of Armadale to purchase and install sensory play equipment to the existing playgrounds. The installation of the new equipment will complement the pre-existing playground equipment and will be connected by a continuous path of new rubber soft fall, which is being funded by the City of Armadale.

### **Augusta Recreation Centre - accessibility upgrades**

\$50,000

This project aims to improve the access to the centre's sporting clubs and facilities for the current user groups, the WA Disabled Sports Association, HACC and the 45 members of the gymnasium who self-identify as having a disability. Upgrades include relocating the gym to the ground level, installing accessible gym equipment, creating accessible doorways, installing an accessible ramp to the hydrotherapy pool, upgrading the accessible toilet to current standards and adding another ACROD parking bay with direct access to the entrance ramp.

### **Beverley Post Office - installation of a ramp and handrails**

\$24,017

Beverley Post Office will install a ramp and handrails to the entrance of the building. The post office provides a range of services, and the upgrades aim to ensure all members of the community can undertake daily activities independently.

### **City of Bunbury - installation of a ramp at Koombana Bay**

\$31,726

The City of Bunbury project involves upgrading the ramp at Koombana Bay. The graded ramp will improve the space as a central, integrated and inclusive access point for the community. The project complements other accessible facilities and programs within the area, including an accessible change room, beach wheelchairs and the Sail into Life program which operates out of Koombana Bay Sail Club.

### **Shire of Capel - Installation of an All Abilities Playspace**

\$55,000

Funding will support the Shire of Capel to purchase and install a bird's nest swing and sand play equipment for the new All Abilities Playspace. The playspace will be located in the new Civic Precinct in Capel's town centre.

### **City of Cockburn - Botany Park upgrades**

\$26,004

The City of Cockburn project will install accessible play equipment at Botany Park playground, as well as construct fencing with accessible entrances. Upgrades at Botany Park will support the two schools within the area that have specialist Education Support Units.

**DADAA Ltd. - Access All Arts - portable audio description and equipment**

\$42,335

DADAA will purchase audio description equipment for arts and cultural activities for people who are blind, vision impaired or deaf-blind to enjoy the performance alongside the mainstream audience. The equipment will deliver a live verbal commentary via a personal headset which provides information on the action and visual elements as they unfold. The equipment is portable and can be installed in any venue.

DADAA and VisAbility also received funding through the Community Inclusion and Participation Grant to provide an Access All Arts program that combines Access Tours and with the Audio Description. Committed arts organisations, venues and events include the Awesome Children's Festival, Fringe World, Perth International Arts Festival, Blue Room, PICA, Regal Theatre and Spare Parts Puppet Theatre, and the Fremantle Street Theatre Festival and Festival Parade.

**Shire of Donnybrook-Balingup - Access All Areas with a Splash**

\$20,625

An accessible pool wheelchair lift will be purchased for use at the Donnybrook Recreation Centre. The portable pool lift will be used for the indoor 25-metre pool, which attracts people of all ages and abilities for sport, recreation, fitness classes, rehabilitation, injury management and family activities.

**Goomalling Post Office - installation of automatic doors**

\$9,893 (incl. GST)

The Goomalling Post Office will install automatic doors at the building's entrance. The post office provides a range of services in the regional town that are not available in neighbouring regions.

**City of Gosnells - Centennial Pioneer Park**

\$44,000

The City of Gosnells will undertake access and inclusion enhancements to the amphitheatre's current steep, grassed seating area. Improved access will increase the opportunity for people with disability to participate in community life.

**City of Greater Geraldton - beach wheelchair access path**

\$50,000

The project will provide a beach wheelchair access path as part of the Geraldton foreshore development plans. The design of the accessible path will include a hand rail to extend accessibility to those with mobility impairments.

**Koorda Community Resource Centre - Opening the doors to close the gap**

\$4,380

The Koorda Community Resource Centre will install automatic doors at the centre's entrance. The centre provides essential services including bank, professional health and Government services, as well as a range of community-focused courses and cultural activities.

**Shire of Manjimup - Accessible pathway: Historical Hamlet**

\$48,769

The Shire of Manjimup will install a 55m accessible pathway linking the six buildings forming the eastern arc of the hamlet. The hamlet is part of the Manjimup Timber and Heritage Park, a 10 hectare park which includes community spaces, events and family-oriented education and historic features.

**Shire of Merredin - installation of automatic entrance doors**

\$21,921

The Shire of Merredin will install automatic entrance doors at two buildings as part of the shire's redevelopment plans. The shire aims to develop a community hub including a library, visitor centre services, aged care accommodation and a range of Government services.

**Mountain View Sporting Club - Access for All**

\$22,000

The Mountain View Sporting Club will be undertaking accessibility upgrades, including widening the club's doors to be wheelchair accessible and installing an accessible toilet.

**Shire of Murray - Leisure Centre Pool Access Project**

\$6,547

The Shire of Murray will purchase a Splash semi-portable aquatic lift to improve access to the Murray Leisure Centre hydrotherapy pool. This is the only hydrotherapy pool in the Peel region.

**Shire of Murray - Library Access Project**

\$11,951 The Shire of Murray will undertake accessibility upgrades to the entrance of the library. The project involves installing a 10m stainless steel handrail for the car park access ramp and replacing a section of the existing path to the main entrance of the building. The completed works will increase access to the building and inclusion of people with disability in Murray Library programs.

**Shire of Nannup - installation of electronic entry doors**

\$43,750

The Shire of Nannup will install electronic doors at its offices, which will help residents to easily access facilities and services located within the building. The Nannup shire offices house Government and non-government services and is the only building in that part of town with an accessible toilet.

**Town of Victoria Park - installation of automatic doors at the Harold Hawthorne Community Centre**

\$38,630

The Town of Victoria Park will undertake accessibility upgrades to improve access into and within the Harold Hawthorne Centre. Key work includes installing automatic doors in the main foyer and reception through to the social hall, and the door to the accessible toilet.

**City of Stirling - purchase of portable pool hoist**

\$21,770

The City of Stirling will purchase a portable pool hoist for the outdoor pool at the Terry Tyzack Aquatic Centre.

**City of Vincent - automatic door for accessible change room**

\$6,050

The City of Vincent will install an automatic door in the accessible change room at Beatty Park Leisure Centre.

**Wize Therapy - purchase of modified and specialised bikes and trikes**

\$19,095

Wize Therapy will purchase a number of disability specific bikes, trikes and accessories. This will provide a pool of bikes for people with disability to hire and trial before purchasing their own. This project supports Wize Therapy's Zebra on Bikes program, which aims to support families with children and young adults with disability to participate in bike riding skills training programs. The second component of the project is funded through the Community Inclusion and Participation Grants.
